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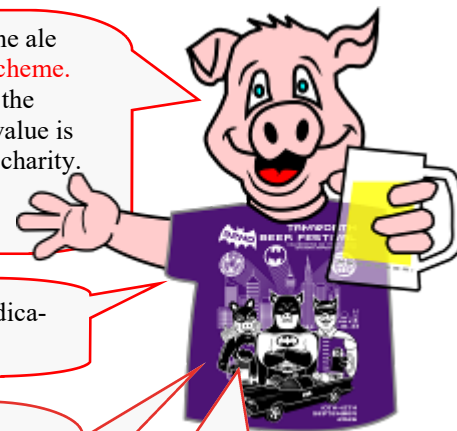
Essential Festival Information

Cask labels carry a graphic code to give an indication of beer colour. Look to the label bottom.

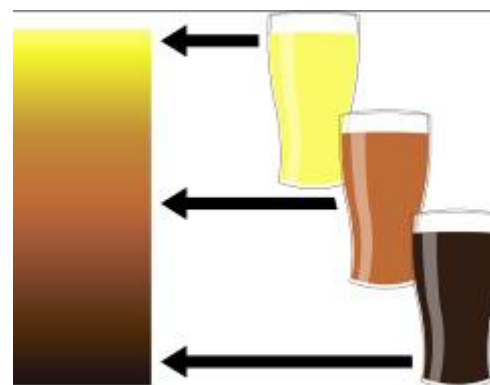

Holy Smoke ...



It was January 1966 when the Dynamic Duo first appeared on television screens in the US, though British audiences would wait until May for ITV to begin screening the antics of the pair. It was an introduction to superheroes clad in tights and Y-fronts, plot lines which were superbly ridiculous, and a range of improbable villains who would have been better off in an institution. And this was intended as entertainment for kids?

Kids loved it, of course, with the ultimate item of playground envy being possession of a Corgi die-cast model of a Batmobile. If you can't think of anything better to do with the best part of a thousand pounds, then you can still buy intact mint examples, complete with teensy plastic missiles to be fired from the rear rocket launchers.

Plot lines were almost a flow chart:

- the villain announces some dastardly crime – steal a diamond, kidnap a celebrity, take over Gotham city with magical umbrellas
- Gotham City police are baffled by the clues – no time to waste, use the Batphone to summon Batman and Boy Wonder
- butler Alfred answers the phone at Wayne Manor, informs the duo, millionaire Bruce Wayne and his teenage ward Dick Grayson
- on go the masks, capes, tights and Y-fronts in the blink of a batpole descent
- the Batmobile covers the 14 miles to Gotham City apparently in seconds
- half-witted police chiefs stand around vacantly while Batman and Robin crack the clues
- the duo confront the villains, a fight ensues with many a Bam! and Kapow!
- Batman and Robin overpowered, placed in mortal danger
- Bat gadgets deployed, villains overpowered in turn, victory for the duo!



What made it all work (arguably!) were the outrageous villains, the very silliness of the plotlines and gadgets, and most importantly, not taking itself at all seriously. The show was often played for laughs, and even most youngsters would not really believe that the duo were climbing up a vertical wall using rope the thickness of string.

The show was produced over a couple of years, and in that time had three series, adding up to a total of 120 episodes. The show was flagging by the end of the second series, resulting in lead actors Adam West and Burt Ward being joined by Yvonne Craig and her newly-minted character of Batgirl.

Batgirl couldn't halt the decline, leading to network ABC deciding to axe the show at the end of series three. There were apparently plans for network NBC to take over, but that in turn was pulled when it was discovered that ABC had destroyed hundreds of thousands of dollars' worth of Batman sets. And there was you thinking all the sets were just made of cardboard ...

The beers are racked up in programme order, alphabetical by brewery name. We have added the following indications where we are certain:

GF - Certified gluten free (<20ppm)

VG - Vegan

V - Vegetarian (usually not VG because of lactose sugars)

3Ps, Woodville, Derbyshire

☐ Krusher 4.6%

IPA featuring Talus and Krush hops, promising flavours of mango, guava, peach and navel orange (VG).

☐ Chocanilla 5.4%

And for afters, a dessert version of the Chocoholic! A vanilla and Belgian chocolate pudding stout.

ALEWORKS, Shipley, West Sussex

☐ Parlour 4.6%

Complex stout with roasty character and notes of coffee and chocolate (VG).

☐ Rogue Harvest 5.0%

Hop-forward modern English IPA with UK hops. Stone fruit flavours, tropical notes (VG).

ALNWICK, Lesbury, Northumberland

☐ Earl Grey IPA 4.2%

Balanced English-style IPA, soft sweetness with citrus flavours and notes of bergamot and black tea.

☐ NEIPA 5.0%

Soft-bodied New England IPA; look for notes of mango, peach, pear and blackcurrant citrus. Now increased from its original strength of 4.6%.

APEX, Sandford Orcas, Dorset

☐ Lights Out Stout 4.5%

Sessionable English stout, rich roastiness and chocolate flavours lead the way (VG).

☐ Muddy Talker 7.0%

In the historic style of a 'keeping' ale, layering black treacle, dark fruits and cocoa flavours (VG).

BARKING CAT, Poole, Dorset

☐ Catacombs 3.4%

Heritage-style 'nourishing stout' made with ten different grains. Full of flavour with a smoky finish.

☐ Feline Fusion 4.8%

Double-dry-hopped hazy NEIPA, Citra and Krush hops. Lactose-led creaminess and tropical flavours.

☐ Cataclysm 4.9%

A robust and rich black treacle-infused oat and milk stout. Smooth and smoky with chocolate and coffee flavours.



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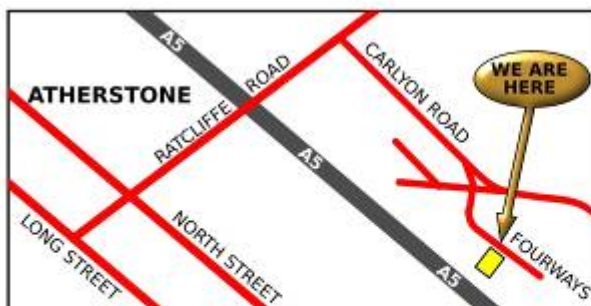

BEOWULF, Brownhills, Staffordshire

- ☐ Feortig 4.2% Assertive American pale ale, full of Citra and Cascade hops. Feortig means 40, celebrating brewer Joe's age.
- ☐ Fruit Salad Pale 4.5% Remember those penny sweets from your youth? Well now that you're all grown up we've put them in a beer!
- ☐ Dark Eggnog 4.5% The shops are already Christmasifying, so we'll join in! This dark mild has been "Christmas'd" with the addition of that Yuletide favourite, Eggnog! (VG).

BREWERS FOLLY, Wimborne, Dorset

- ☐ Overcast 4.8% Easy-drinking tropical-accented pale ale. Cascade hops in the boil, Simcoe and Mosaic for dry hopping (VG).
- ☐ 10w-40 5.0% A rich and full-bodied stout, notes of caramel, toffee and chocolate. It's not old engine oil, honestly (VG).

CERNE ABBAS, Cerne Abbas, Dorset

- ☐ Gurt Coconuts Rum Stout 6.7% Award-winning stout, matured in rum casks to give a comforting, coconutty depth of character

CHURCH END, Ridge Lane, Warwickshire

- ☐ Purple Rain 3.6% New amber beer for autumn. Stone fruit flavours with a touch of caramel, and a firm bitter finish.
- ☐ More Than A Pennyworth 3.8% Plum mild, flavoured with locally grown fruit. Full disclosure, some scrumping was involved.
- ☐ Brew's Wayne 4.1% Gotham City's finest drinks a coffee and apricot beer? Bat-tastic! Pale in colour.
- ☐ Batman's Bevvv 4.2% Well, he likes wearing his underpants on the outside so he'll like this dark raspberry and mint brew.
- ☐ Beer Cave Brew 4.2% Golden brew featuring those natural bedfellows of butternut squash and basil.
- ☐ Chief O'Hara's Hooch 4.2% Bejasus! A banana and toffee stout. Would yerz be wantin' a spoon with that?
- ☐ Batzooka! 4.4% Pale brew featuring a veritable cocktail of mango, coconut and lime.

- ☐ Joker's Jar 7.0% He's having a laugh! Earn your superhero stripes by trying this tandoori masala barley wine!

CRICH, Belper, Derbyshire

- ☐ Mini 3.7% Light but punchy hazy pale, featuring Motueka, Idaho 7 and Nectarone hops (VG).
- ☐ Metal Dave 5.6% A smooth, hazy and juicy pale ale with lively and refreshing hop expression from Citra, Simcoe, Mosaic and Krush varieties (GF, VG).
- ☐ Voodoo Empress 8.4% Festival one-off: an Imperial-strength version of last year's beer of the festival, Voodoo Lady! It's a velvety crème brûlée stout, decadent flavours of caramelised sugar, scorched vanilla and dark chocolate. Spell-binding!

- ☐ Bitter 4.2% A five-malt bitter with biscuity, dark fruit flavours and hints of caramel. First Gold and Bramling Cross hops (VG).

- ☐ Old Coach Road 3.9% Best bitter from the new White Hart brewpub, whose ales are rarely seen outside the pub (VG).
- ☐ Bleadon Hell! 4.5% Hazy pale (VG).

- ☐ Seedspitter 4.6% A hazy wheat beer base with banana and tropical fruit yeast flavours, plus juicy watermelon. Minus the seeds we hope (VG).

- ☐ Candy Orange Citra Pale 4.2% Single hopped pale ale with Citra hops. Added candy orange gives a fresh citrus bite.
- ☐ Bohemian Cherry & Plum 5.9% Deep and complex rich porter with multilayered, subtle flavours of cherries and crushed plums (VG).

LOGAN BECK, Duddon Bridge, Cumbria

- ☐ Proper Cumbrian 6.0% A barrel-aged green-hop beer, using locally grown hops picked last September. Strong, bitter and malty.

- ☐ Ernie's Tipple 4.2% Classic best bitter, dark amber in colour. English and German malts, Goldings hops. Notes of spicy honey (VG).

NEW BUILDINGS, Hinckley, Leicestershire

- ☐ The Batcave 4.5% KAPOW! A tasty chocolate orange porter hitting you with a zesty orange punch.
- ☐ Arkham Asylum 5.5% A raspberry wheat beer with a flavour profile that is completely unhinged and so fruity it belongs in a padded cell. Even the Joker would take it seriously.

ORM'S ØL, Great Ormside, Cumbria

- ☐ Mýkr 3.9% English mild with a varied grain bill plus a touch of smoked malt. Low hop presence and a subtle bittersweet edge in the finish (GF).
- ☐ Rauðr 4.5% Full-bodied red ale with a touch of caramel. Northdown, Amarillo and Phoenix hops give an earthy spiciness and subtle citrus (GF).
- ☐ Døkk 5.0% Prize-winning smoky coffee-chocolate stout. Rich, silky and full of flavour (GF).

- ☐ Holy Hops Batman! 4.3% Festival special pale ale, made while the brewer was wearing a cape, mask, and underpants outside his trousers. He's seeing his shrink about it.

TANGENT, Bristol, Gloucestershire

- ☐ Choc Van Port 4.1% Smooth session porter with notes of coffee and chocolate, and a gentle vanilla sweetness in the background (VG).
- ☐ Bitter & Twisted 4.3% Amber best bitter with those classic English hops, Fuggles and Goldings. Aromas of caramelised malt (VG).

TEMPEST, Tweedbank, Borders

- ☐ Long White Cloud 5.2% A New Zealand extra pale ale featuring Kiwi hops: Nelson Sauvin and Motueka. Expect delicate citrus, fruit and floral notes (GF, VG).

THIRSTY MOOSE, Blaydon-on-Tyne, Tyne and Wear

- ☐ Peach To Their Own 4.1% Peach pale ale, fruit and malt flavours plus an earthy hop profile. See, it's not all Newky Brown up north! (VG).

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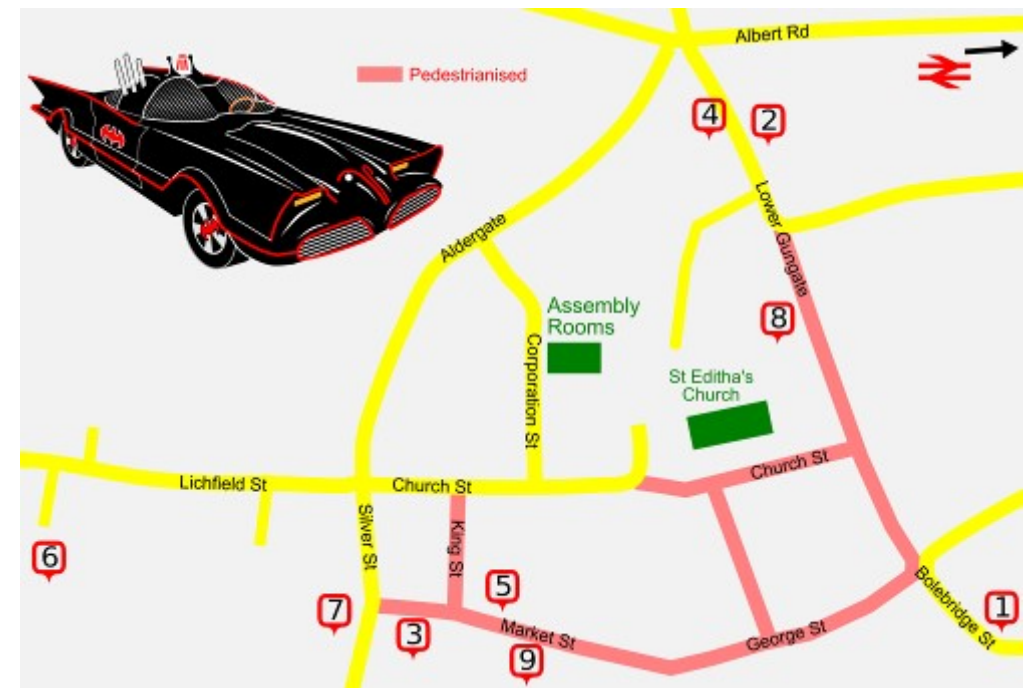


Town Crawl
